Benefits of Reading Your Water Meter

- Regular reading of your water meter allows you to keep your account current and accurate.
- Your water bill is then based on your actual consumption instead of an estimate that could result in inaccurate billing.
- If you have had a number of estimated reads, followed by an actual read — you may see a sudden rise in your water bill amount if your water consumption was higher than what was estimated.
- When you do consistent, actual reads you can monitor your actual water consumption—this can help identify any plumbing leaks in toilets or fixtures sooner—saving money.

The compost site is located south of Town on Toroncuk Avenue, east of E. Bourassa and Sons. Dumping of compost at the old site located in the Rodeo Grounds is prohibited.

ATV's are NOT for use within Town limits....

ATV's can only operate off the owner's property and within Town limits, by the most direct route available in order to operate these machines outside of the Town boundaries. Driving on/over lawns, through parks and on Town streets is prohibited.

You must be 16 years of age and hold a valid driver's license to operate an ATV on public land.

Youth between the ages of 12 and 15 can operate an ATV on public land and may cross roads (but cannot drive on roads) if they have passed an approved ATV training course, or if they're supervised by someone who has held a driver's license continuously for the last 365 days. The supervising rider can be riding a different ATV or be on the same ATV as the youth.

Please Remember...

- When Town employees are busy cleaning the streets or doing any other work on the streets, please take precautions when passing the Town equipment. If you happen to see crews working on the streets find an alternate route until the work is complete. This would help to make their job safer.
- Barricades and road closed signs need to be adhered to.
- Vehicles, campers, recreation equipment and trailers are not to be parked on the street for more than 48 hours, and parking is not allowed in lanes or alleys. If your vehicle is not used regularly, you must park it on your own property.

Dog and Cat Owners

- Any resident who owns a dog/cat within Town limits must register their pets with the Town Office.
- Licenses are due January 1st of each year; the fee is \$20 for each dog/cat, unless it is considered to be a restricted dog. Restricted dog license fees are \$250 per dog, please refer to Bylaw No. 2016-15 for a list of restricted dogs.
- Pets shall wear a collar and the tag is to be attached to the collar.
- The purpose of registration is to have a record of dogs/cats in Town, which allows us to contact owners in situations when necessary.
- Every person who, being in charge of a dog or cat, which defecates on public property or on any private property without the owner's permission and who fails to immediately collect, remove and dispose of such fecal matter is guilty of an infraction of Bylaw No. 2016-15. Please be kind to your neighbors and those walking the streets and pick up after your pet.



SaskAlert is the Government of Saskatchewan's emergency public alerting program that provides critical information on emergencies in real time, so you can take action to protect yourself, your family and your property. An emergency alert issued through SaskAlert will let you know: what the emergency is, where it is happening, provide instructions for you to follow to stay safe, and advise you when the incident is over.

FYI...

- Please check your trees and bushes. It is the property owner's responsibility to ensure that trees and bushes do not obstruct back lanes and alleys.
- Please ensure you keep your property clean and tidy, this includes keeping it mowed and free of debris and garbage.
- A building permit is required to ensure that all buildings are constructed in accordance with the National Building Code.
- Starting a project before obtaining a permit can result in increased fees, as well as time and expense to change plans.
- If you hire an out of town contractor, you are required to have them provide proof of business license from the Town of Radville.
