





Any action requested or taken must be clear and transparent by the complainant. Anonymous concerns/complaints will not be given considerations.



Saving Water Will Save You Money

Even the smallest leak has the potential of causing a large utility bill. The majority of leaks occur in the bathroom and the most common culprit is the toilet. Residents can see if their toilet is leaking by:

- Putting a few drops of food coloring in the toilet tank, wait 15 minutes and then check to see if the water in the toilet bowl changed color.
- If the water has changed color, the toilet is leaking.

Dripping faucets are another common source of water leaks. Ensuring the taps are tight can often prevent this.
