

# RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF LAURIER NO. 38

## BYLAW NO. 6-2021

### A BYLAW TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE DUMPING OF REFUSE ON PROPERTY UNDER THE OWNERSHIP OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF LAURIER NO. 38

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Laurier No. 38, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

1. This bylaw shall be referred to as the "Anti-Dumping Bylaw".
2. Definitions for the purpose of this bylaw:
  - a) "Municipality" means the Rural Municipality of Laurier No. 38.
  - b) "Waste" means any discarded or abandoned organic, or inorganic material, including material of by-products discarded in a manufacturing or producing process; dirt; rocks; rubble; garbage; tree cuttings; grass; leaves; empty or partly empty tins, boxes, cartons, bottles and containers; discarded paper and fabrics; discarded household utensils; household furniture; household appliances of any nature; trees; concrete; tire; snow; ice; construction materials; or any other refuse, rubble or matter.
  - c) "Dumping" means abandoning waste or causing to be abandoned in any location under the control of the Rural Municipality of Laurier No. 38.
3. Pursuant to Subsection 3(1) of *The Litter Control Act*, dumping waste on property owned, leased or under control of the Municipality is prohibited. No person shall dump or dispose or cause to be dumped or disposed any waste on any property owned by the Municipality, leased by the Municipality, or under the jurisdictions and control of the Municipality.
4. Any person found guilty of this offence shall be, liable on summary conviction to the penalties pursuant to Section 4 of *The Litter Control Act*.
5. In addition to the penalties legislated, a person convicted of an offence pursuant to this Bylaw shall also be responsible for the cost incurred by the Municipality for waste disposal and clean-up at an hourly rate and:
  - a) The charge shall not be less than one hour minimum.
  - b) The hourly rate shall be calculated as the sum of the following:
    - i. Labour cost for two employees at their current rate of hourly pay; and
    - ii. Current custom work rates established by Council.
6. This bylaw shall come into effect on the day of its final passing.
