Dog and Cat Owners

- Any resident who owns a dog/cat within Town limits must register their pets with the Town office.
- Licenses are due January 1st of each year; the fee is \$20 for each dog/cat. Restricted dog license fees are \$250 per dog, please refer to Bylaw No. 2016-15 for a list of restricted dogs.
- Pets shall wear a collar and the tag is to be attached to the collar. The purpose of registration is to have a record of dogs/cats in Town, which allows us to contact owners in situations where necessary.
- No person shall possess more than 2 dogs or 2 cats per dwelling unit.

Please be mindful that when snow mounds build up it can cause visibility restraints for drivers.

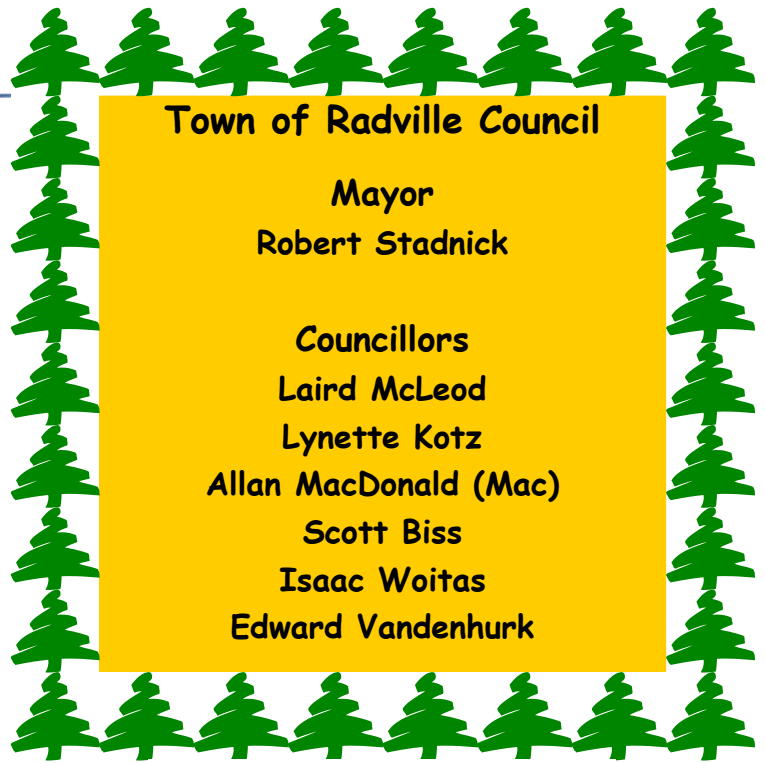
Following a snowfall please move any vehicles parked on the street. This will assist the Town staff to be able to clear streets in a timely and effective manner.

Waste Management Area Hours October 2024 — March 2025

Wednesday 3:00 — 5:00 p.m.

All loads taken to the Waste Management Area need to be tarped and/or secured to prevent loss of debris.

Violators will be fined.

The Waste Management Area is located 2 miles south, 2 miles east and 1/2 mile north



Garbage and recycle carts are to be put out on the street on or BEFORE 7 AM. If you miss pick up because your bin was not out at 7 AM, it is your responsibility to dispose of the contents.

Landlords Be Aware

Section 369 of *The Municipalities Act*, provides the authority to add outstanding utility accounts to the tax roll whether it was supplied to the owner or renter of the property. If the amounts are added to the tax roll of a parcel of land the amount is deemed for all purposes to be tax imposed from the date it was added to the roll and forms a lien against the parcel of land in favor of the municipality.

Once the outstanding amount has been transferred to property taxes, it is due and payable by the property owner.

As the property owner, you have the option to have the account for your rental property in your name and subsequently, charge your tenant through your rental rates.

A disconnection fee of \$75.00 is required when requesting the water be shut off as well as a \$75 reconnection fee when the water is requested to be turned back on.

Registering Concerns

Please remember common courtesy when registering concerns with the Town of Radville. The Town policy is intended to set out the generally accepted procedures for residents when reporting concerns or filing complaints with Council or Staff.

All concerns/complaints must be clearly identified in writing and must fall within the ability of the Town of Radville to deal with under the current Provincial Legislation.

Any action requested or taken must be clear and transparent by the complainant.

Anonymous concerns/complaints will not be given consideration.



Benefits of Reading Your Water Meter

- Regular reading of your water meter allows you to keep your account current and accurate.
- Your water bill is then based on your actual consumption instead of an estimate that could result in inaccurate billing.
- If you have had a number of estimated reads, followed by an actual read — you may see a sudden rise in your water bill amount if your water consumption was higher than what was estimated.
- When you do consistent, actual reads you can monitor your actual water consumption — this can help identify any plumbing leaks in toilets or fixtures sooner — saving money.
